# Where to Go When You Need Care Now

With UC SHIP, your first stop for non-emergency care is always your student health center (SHC). But when you can't wait to get care, you have options.

#### **NON-URGENT CARE**

#### **Student Health Center**

Start here when you can. Your SHC provides outpatient medical, preventive care, mental health, and substance use disorder services. It's staffed with board-certified physicians, certified nurse practitioners, and physician assistants, all of whom are experts in meeting student health care needs. Certain SHCs also provide pharmacy services.

#### **NEED MENTAL HEALTH CARE?**

From 24/7 one-on-one support to app-based treatment, UC SHIP offers a variety of emotional well-being care options.

### 24/7 Advice Nurse

Average copay: \$0

Call your SHC's 24/7 advice nurse or Anthem's 24/7 NurseLine (available 365 days a year, holidays included) for assistance with questions like:

- Can my problem be treated at home?
- Do I need to see a doctor?
- Should I head to the emergency room?

#### LiveHealth Online

Average copay: \$0-\$25, depending on your campus

See a doctor online, 24/7, with <u>LiveHealth Online</u>. If you need a prescription, they'll send it to your local pharmacy. You can use LiveHealth Online for common medical conditions, including:

- Flu
- Minor rashes
- Allergies
- Cold and fever
- Diarrhea

- Headaches
- Pinkeye
- · Tooth pain

#### **URGENT CARE**

#### **Student Health Center**

Call your SHC to see if a same-day appointment is available. You may be able to speak with a doctor by phone, even if you can't wait for an appointment.

## **Urgent Care Center**

Average copay: \$25-\$50 (in-network); 40%-50% coinsurance after deductible (out-of-network)

Go to an urgent care center for immediate care for an illness or injury that isn't life-threatening but needs to be treated right away. Some urgent care centers do X-rays, lab tests, and stitches.

Common urgent care needs include:

- Earaches
- Sore throats
- Fevers
- Tests for flu, strep and urinary tract infections
- Simple cuts
- Nausea, vomiting and diarrhea
- Mild asthma

#### **KNOW BEFORE YOU GO**

You'll pay a moderate copay if you choose an urgent care center in the <u>Anthem network</u> (Find Care > Log In or Search as a Guest). You'll pay a lot more if you go to an out-of-network urgent care center.

#### **EMERGENCY CARE**

# **Emergency Room**

Average copay: up to \$200; copay waived if you're admitted

Head to the emergency room or call 911 for a life-threatening emergency, including:

- Severe shortness of breath
- Loss of consciousness
- Coughing up or vomiting blood
- Broken bones
- Major injuries
- High fever with mental confusion
- Chest pain; numbness in the face, arm or leg; or difficulty speaking
